Dr. Dennis J. McTigue is Professor of Pediatric Dentistry at The Ohio State University College of Dentistry. He earned his D.D.S. and M.S. in Pediatric Dentistry from the University of Iowa. From 1976 through 1984 he taught in the Department of Pediatric Dentistry at Louisiana State University and served as Chair of the Department of Dentistry at Children's Hospital in New Orleans, La. He chaired the Department of Pediatric Dentistry at The Ohio State

University, College of Dentistry from 1984 through 1991. From 1991 through 2002, he served the College as Associate Dean for Academic Affairs. He is a Director of the American Board of Pediatric Dentistry, a Fellow of the American College of Dentists, and a member of the College of Diplomates of the ABPD. He is past president of the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry and of the Academy of Dentistry for the Handicapped and past chair of the Commission on Dental Accreditation. He has maintained a private practice in pediatric dentistry for over 30 years and has served consultantships to the U.S. Air Force, the American Dental Association and a variety of state and federal health agencies.
